Civilian Personnel Advisory Center (CPAC)

What is the Military Spouse Preference (MSP) Program?

The purpose of the Military Spouse Preference (MSP) Program is to lessen the career interruption of spouses who relocate to accompany their military sponsor on a permanent change of station (PCS) move.

Appropriated Funds

- Spouse must be listed on the PCS orders as a dependent.
- Spouse must be a US citizen.
- Eligibility is good for **2 years** from the date that the orders were cut, or until acceptance or declination of a full-time federal position. (which ever comes first)

Non-Appropriated Funds

- Spouse must be listed on the PCS orders as a dependent.
- Spouse **DOES NOT** have to be a US citizen.
- Eligibility is good for the duration of the entire tour, or until acceptance or declination of a regular continuing position.

Child Supervisory Policy



- Children **Newborn - 8 y/o** will have close supervision at all times.
- Children **9-12 y/o** may be left unattended in quarters for a max of two hours during the day.
- Children **13 y/o** may be left unattended in quarters for a max of three hours during the day.
- Children **14 y/o** may be left unattended for a max of six hours.
- Children **15-17 y/o** of age may be left unattended in quarters for a max of eight hours.
- Children **9-17 y/o** must be provided a telephone number where the parent(s)/guardian(s) can be reached as well as telephone numbers for the police and fire department and the hospital.



Child Supervisory Policy



GUIDELINES FOR BABYSITTING

- Children **13 years of age and older** may care for younger children if they have attended the Babysitting Class for teens.
- Children **13-14 years of age** may care for younger siblings for a maximum of three hours, without direct supervision.
- Children **15-17 years of age** may care for younger siblings for a maximum eight hours, without direct supervision. This does not include overnight care.
- Children will not be supervised by anyone **under 18 years of age** for more than eight hours overnight.



Curfew For Children Under 18



- Children **11 years of age or younger** shall be inside their home or someone else's home between 2100-0600.
- Children who are **12 years or more of age**, but less than 15 years of age, shall be inside their home or someone else's home between 2200-0600.
- Children who, are **15 years of age, but less than 18 years of age**, shall be inside their home or someone else's home between midnight and 0600.
- **Children 11 years of age and under** will not be left unattended for any period in a vehicle.








- Driving on Post
 - GA 144 / GA119
 - Seatbelt's are Mandatory
 - Bluetooth usage
 - No texting
 - No headphones
 - No loud music while driving- audible within 50ft
 - Revelry and Retreat- Stop and get out



GCSM Highlights Cont.

- Motorcycles- Must wear reflective vest
 - No PT Belts
- PT's not allowed in AAFEs
- Headgear
- Social Media
- Political Activities- Not in uniform





Standards of Dress and Prohibited Attire

- All clothing with profanity, distasteful language, illicit drug, drug paraphernalia, gang affiliation, illegal activity, or Anti-U.S. Government remarks.
- No sagging pants, cut-off shorts with visible pockets, skirts no shorter than half way to the top of the knee.
- Swim suits as outer garments (except at the pool), no exposed midriffs.
- Hair curlers or rollers, unless covered by a scarf.



Current Problem Trends



- **Loud Music**
 - Loud Music heard from a vehicle at a distance of:
 - 0 to 49 ft. results in issuance of a DA 1408 and BN/BDE CDR notification
 - 50+ ft. could result in issuance of DA 1408 / CVB and driving privileges suspended up to 6 months
- **Cell Phone Use**
 - The only authorized use of a cell phone while operating a vehicle is with a hands free device
 - Holding a cell phone while on speaker does not constitute hands free!
- **Seatbelt Safety**
 - Everyone must wear seatbelts at all times when riding in a vehicle on any federal installation
 - It is the responsibility of the driver to ensure all passengers are buckled up
- **Speeding**
 - There is an On Post Driving Points System
 - An additional \$200 fine is added to any ticket if classified as a “Super Speeder”
 - 85 mph or higher on any road or highway is considered “Super Speeder”
 - 75 mph or higher on any 2 lane road or highway is considered “Super Speeder” (GA 144 / 199)
- **GA 144 / 119**
 - Be on the lookout for wildlife entering the highway
 - Slow down when around military traffic / active training areas
 - Use common sense when passing vehicles
