Registration is under way and will continue until 30 minutes before the 8 a.m., Feb. 27, for the 50 Bird Skeet Tournament at the Fort Stewart Skeet and Trap Range, building 8332.

The event is open to Soldiers, Family Members, retirees, Department of Defense employees and their guests. Registration is \$20 per shooter. Free food will be provided.

Shooters will compete in six divisions, including the following: Rocky Division (experts); Dogface Division (intermediate); Iron Mike Division (novice); Annie Oakley Division (women), and the Bullwinkle Division (youth ages 12 to 17). A B.O.S.S. Single Soldiers Division was also added to the event.

Michael Moore, shooting sports manager for the Outdoor Recreation division of Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation, said the shooting divisions

will be based on a skill level from one to 10, with 10 being expert.

A pre-tournament "Marne Muster" will be held 5:30 p.m., Feb. 25 to discuss rules and set up shooting brackets.

Prizes to be offered in each division are first place, \$40; second, \$30; and third, \$20. There must be five competitors for all three places to be awarded in a division, Moore said. The highest single round score in each division will win an extra \$10 prize.

Those who do not have their own weapon shouldn't hesitate to sign up for the tournament,

"We will have some 12 and 20 gauge shotguns available for eligible shooters who do not have them," Moore said.

Ammunition will be available for purchase.

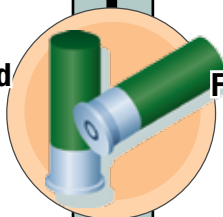
