## Elmo and friends come to town

More than 2,500 Soldiers, Family Members, retirees, Department of Defense civilians and especially their children were treated to The Sesame Street Experience for Military Families, Oct. 10, on its opening night at Fort Stewart's Newman Fitness Center. There were also three more showings, Oct. 11, with crowds filling the basketball court area of Newman.

"This year's tour began last April and with military Families going through multiple deployments, the show is designed to help children cope," said Josh Bourque, Sesame Street Experience performance director.

The Sesame Workshop, the nonprofit organization behind Sesame Street, and the United Service Organizations partnered to bring the "experience" to Families at 43 military installations across the country, Fort Stewart being number 35.

The free, traveling tour included a 60-minute experience and featured a 25-minute live Muppet performance, giveaways from outreach organizations providing materials for the military Family community, and a group photo framed by the Muppets.

The tour was exclusively for military Families on the installation and a part

of Sesame Workshop's "Talk, Listen, Connect" initiative - a military outreach program that launched in 2006.

"I think that this is great because my children have been wanting to see Elmo ever since they could say it," said Spc. Misty Brown, Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 4th Battalion, 3rd Aviation Regiment.

Her husband Spc. Theodore Brown, Company D, 4/3 Avn., felt that "It's also great that we didn't have to pay to see the show."

The bilingual, multimedia show provided an eye full with dancing and singing, all inclusive with a skit focused on coping and support with significant guidance to military Families with young children between the ages of 2 and 5 experiencing the effects due to multiple deployments.

"Being on this tour has helped change my perspective and opinion about the military," said Bourque.

"I really have respect for the military now and I speak for the whole cast and crew when I say this, we are here doing this for the Families."

The Sesame Experience's next stop is Fort Belvoir, in Alexandria, Va. 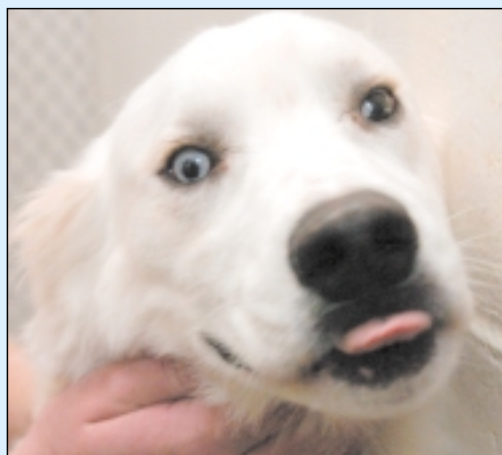

### MEDDAC expands services: lab results online

All beneficiaries who have labs drawn at Winn Army Community Hospital, Tuttle Army Health Clinic or Hawks Troop Medical Clinic, regardless of where they drawn, now have the option of getting their lab results online.

Some of the most common lab results are available, however certain

labs are not. Especially sensitive labs which could require direct notification (ex. HIV, biopsies), or some results which are too difficult to display (ex. pap smear results) are not available at this time. This is the beginning of a trial period and as we progress, we will improve the system and expand the lab results offered online.

As soon as the lab is completed, it will be displayed online. For most labs,

that occurs within 24-72 hours. Some results may not be available for a week or two, but most will be done the same day.

Patients can log-on and view their own labs without waiting for a phone call from the clinic. Most labs are easily interpreted with standard references displayed, but the patient can still call with any questions. But if there are no questions, there is no need to call.

All you have to do is visit Winn's Web site [www.winn.amedd.army.mil](http://www.winn.amedd.army.mil) and click on the link for prescription refills and lab results. You will need to register for a Rapid RX account. Once logged in, click on Lab Results and then either read the lab result/status or click on the lab to get the result. While you are on the Rapid RX Web site you can also refill your prescriptions online. If you have any questions, please call 435-6633.

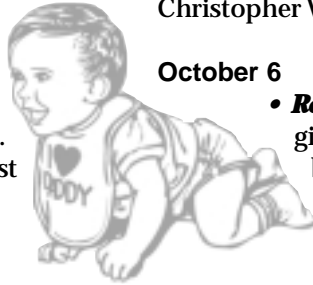

# Remember those who gave their all

William J. Bennett wrote in his 2002 book, *Why We Fight: Moral Clarity and the Age of Terrorism*: "Todd Beamer, Jeremy Glick, and Tom Burnett were passengers on United Airlines Flight 93, hijacked by al-Qaeda terrorists on Sept. 11. Like the other doomed planes that had been seized by terrorists that morning, this one was intended to be used as a missile, probably to destroy the White House or the Capitol in Washington. But Beamer, Glick, Burnett, and others thwarted the terrorists' intention, forcing the plane down in rural Pennsylvania – at the cost of their own and their fellow passengers' lives, but saving the innocent lives of countless others and

preventing still another devastating blow to their country's national symbols. They became, instead, national symbols themselves" (159-60).

I continue to marvel at the selfless service of those Bennett mentions, as I do every Soldier that serves our country in the Global War on Terrorism. As a chaplain at Fort Stewart, I am particularly stuck by the efforts every one of you have made over the last several years to defend the freedoms and liberties we enjoy as Americans. You too have become national symbols – forever etched in our country's history and landscape.

Beyond the efforts of those on Flight 93 and the Soldiers of 3rd ID, we are all reminded of the greatest sacrifice ever made – that of Christ Jesus our Lord. Writing to church at Rome, St. Paul said: "*God presented*

*him [Jesus] as a sacrifice for atonement, through faith in His blood. He did this to demonstrate His justice, because in His forbearance He had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished – He did it to demonstrate his justice at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus" (Romans 3:35-26).*

As we remember those who have selflessly given their lives for our country and those who daily offer themselves in service for the defense of freedoms, may the sacrifice of our Lord be a constant source of comfort for us all.

For in this sacrifice, we have not merely a symbol, but a God whose justice and love promises us something greater than anyone on this earth can ever offer – everlasting life.

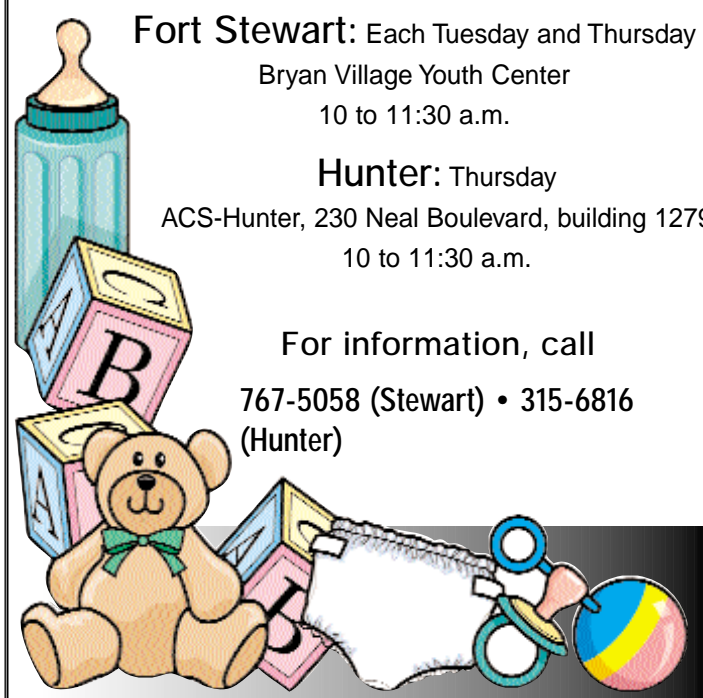

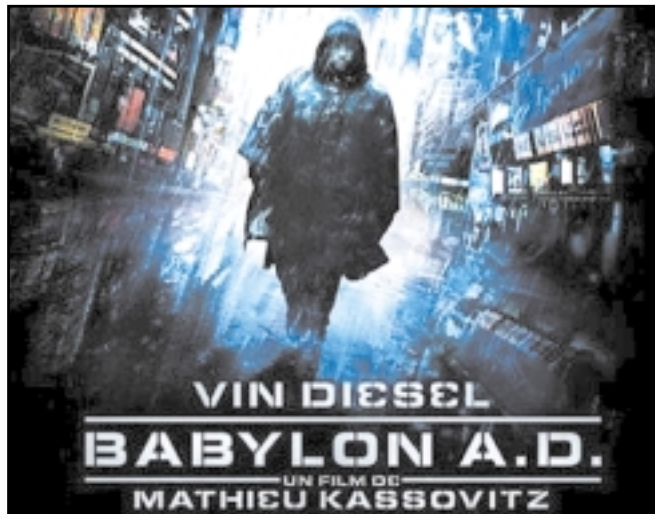
