Stewart museum unveils Iraqi Freedom display

The Fort Stewart Museum unveiled its new Operation Iraqi Freedom display April 7.

Spc. Daniel Lee, an A Company, 2nd Battalion, 7th Infantry Regiment Soldier, said, after examining the museum's new display, that he thought it did a good job of conveying the feeling behind the photos.

"The quotes they have here (under the photographs) are only something you can get from someone who was in actual combat," he said.

Jim Dietz, an artist who has been commissioned to do a painting depicting the 3rd Infantry Division (Mechanized) in OIF that will be added to the display, was also introduced at the museum's reopening.

"It makes me feel honored, and also in a way challenged," Dietz said about his upcoming project. "It will be a challenge to portray the (3rd Inf. Div.) the way it should be."

"It will also be a challenge to convey that I am merely an artist," he continued, "and that first off,

the recognition should go to the people I'm painting, rather than to myself."

Spc. Jeffrey Fennell, another A Co., 2/7 Soldier, was one of the models for Dietz's painting, and said he felt fortunate to have the opportunity to be a part of history.

"It means a lot," he said. "When I have grandkids, I can show them that, yeah, that's me in that picture, and that's what I did in Iraq."

Dietz explained his painting, saying, "The situation we're doing is a typical scene that anyone in the (3rd Inf. Div.) might identify with. It's not a particular battle and it's not a particular action — it's one in which any unit might say, 'I remember seeing that happening.'"

He continued, "It brings in the human element of the Soldiers as they are and as they were."

"It's a good feeling," Fennell stated. "I don't look for the credit; I don't ask to be patted on the back, but ... to have a picture done, that's really neat. It lets people that don't know a lot about the military see what we do on a daily basis."

Lee added, "It's our history ... you can't deny stuff that's happened, and not to preserve it would be like denying it."

Col. Robert L. Caslen, assistant division commander (Maneuver) greeted those gathered.


Chaplain (Maj.) Robert Whitlock, 3rd Inf. Div. chaplain, called the audience to worship and they rose to sing hymns.

The ceremony also included an Old Testament teaching from Isaiah, responsive reading, pastoral prayer, an Easter message and benediction.

Nanette O'Neill sang a hymn for the audience and led them in another toward the end of the service.

"This is the most significant religious event for Christians all year," said Chaplain (Maj.) Mitchell Lewis, Division Artillery chaplain and event coordinator. "We make a big deal out of it because it's

"There were representatives from all the congregations participating," Lewis added. "We all came together to celebrate the resurrection together."

"If Christ be not risen ... what is there to back up the claims he made for himself?" Yacovone said during the benediction.

"If Christ be not risen, then all who sleep in the silent city of the dead will not

live again.

"He is the everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace," he said.

"Our redeemer lives, he lives, thank you God Almighty, he lives."

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Greetings in the name of the Lord

We have just finished up the Easter Season which for the Christian is the most promising and rewarding of all Christian holidays. You may ask, why Easter as opposed to Christmas or any other holiday?

The answer is very easy. Although Christ's coming was foretold for thousands of years and his arrival was a miracle, Easter is the power of the Gospel. The resurrection of Jesus from the dead is the final piece of the puzzle that assures those who are found in Christ at death are resurrected to eternal life.

In fact the Bible says the believer only falls asleep, that we do not die! This is an awesome truth. My words are not spoken in the hope that we can gain eternal life, but as a promise that for God's Children it will happen.



The great thing is that it did not stop there and he prevailed over death and sin and rose to once again be seated in the position of authority as God.

Let me close with a small piece of assurance from the empty tomb that day. In **John 20:7** an interesting fact is noticed by Peter who went to see what he had been told about, which was the body missing from the tomb.

When Peter arrived he noticed that the linen that had been wrapped around Jesus' head was folded neatly and laying to the side. Some theories have stated the body was stolen. If this were the case the garment would not have been folded. The person (Jesus) that was laid dead in the tomb, left this little reminder that he was there, buried wearing a Jewish cloth around his head, and left it there neatly folded when he rose from the dead.

Be strong in the faith. The world does not have the answer to eternal life. Only Jesus, who left his eternal home in Heaven to die for sins and rose victorious on that first resurrection morning, can assure you this gift.






