# Top of the Rock

More than 100 runners from Fort Stewart and the local community competed Saturday in the annual Top of the Rock run.

"We have the run once a year on post," said Perry Yawn, Intramural Sports director. "Everybody likes different things ... so we try to meet everybody's needs on post."

Participants had the option to compete in the five- or 10-kilometer runs in multiple age categories or the team category. The run route started at Bundy Avenue, looped around to 18th Street to Wilson Avenue and finished at 6th Street. 10-kilometer runners did two laps.

"We include the team concept so

units can compete together and build esprit de corps," Yawn said.

The top three winning teams for the 10-kilometer run were the 11th Engineer Battalion, which took first place with a combined time of seven hours, two minutes and 41 seconds, 2nd Battalion, 7th Infantry Regiment, which took second with a combined time of 7:30:48 and A Company, 703rd Main Support Battalion, which had a combined time of 7:31:04.

The top three winners for the 5K run were 1st place Shane Kersten at 17:15, 2nd place DeAndre Cameron at 19:17 and Charles Keese at 19:48.

Kersten, who is getting ready to leave for basic training, said he came out and ran his first mile fast to set the tone for the rest of the course.

The top three 10K winners were

Robert Baier (37:29), Sam Donnelly (38:18) and Michael Wagner (39:15).

"I'm really proud to be winner. The run definitely gets everyone out here," Baier said.

Last year there was about 389 participants which dropped this year but Yawn attributes this to most of the 3rd Infantry Division (Mechanized) returning from Iraq.

Even with fewer people participating, the Intramural Sports Division still worked hard and the runners noticed it.

Baier praised the whole setup, from the water stations to the Military Police, who cleared the way in their patrol car for the runners.

He added, "I really appreciate the staff. (With) things like this, they really go the extra mile."
