USMC dunks DFAC for Hunter title

Food service superstars come up short after winning first game

The USMC's 2nd Beach Terminal Operations Company beat the Hunter Dining Facility 68 - 42 to win the Hunter Intramural Basketball Championship March 16 at Hunter Gym.

The DFAC had beat USMC earlier in the evening, 68 - 60, to climb out of the loser's bracket of the double elimination tournament, overcoming an 11-point deficit in the first half.

"They outlasted us in the first game," said Archie Shubert, USMC forward, who scored 17 points in

game one, including three 3-pointers. "In the second game, we were hungry and treated every possession like it was our last."

The top scorer in game one with 24 points, DFAC guard Terrance Summerville, agreed.

"(In the first game) we came out worrying about the scoreboard and not what was happening on the court, but we stuck together and pulled it off," he said. "The second game — we just ran out of gas."

In game two, USMC jumped out to an 8 - 0 lead just two minutes into the affair. DFAC struggled to get back on defense, which

allowed USMC to convert on multiple fast breaks.

USMC guard Kevin Scott had 12 points and two 3-pointers at the break, increasing the DFAC deficit to 21 points, 38 - 17.

The second half saw much of the same for both teams.

Though the DFAC opened scoring in the second half, they were unable to swing momentum in their favor and, just four minutes into the half, trailed USMC 50 - 21 following a Shubert 3-point basket.

USMC's largest lead of

Bulldawgs take interpost title, 54-48

B Company, 3rd Forward Support Battalion Bulldawgs defeated the 2nd Beach Terminal Operations Company Marines 54 - 48 in the intramural basketball championship game between Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield Friday at Newman Physical Fitness Center.

"Play like we've been playing the whole season with a hard defense and capitalizing on the offense was our strategy," said coach and forward Byrd Johnson.

Pedro Ferri led the Bulldawgs with a total of 20 points against the Marines.

"Coming into the second half we were down but we just needed to come together as a team and start scoring," Ferri said.

Ferri's performance included a slam-dunk at the start of the second half that got the crowd and his bench excited as his team was down coming into the second.

Sterling Tyler followed up Ferri with 17 points to help contribute to the Bulldawg's victory.

Keithon Pittman led for the Marines with 29 points against the Bulldawgs.

Pittman opened the game with a 2-point shot to get things started for the Marines. The teams traded points for most of the first half. The Marines' more aggressive offense tipped the points slightly in their team's favor. The Bulldawgs concentrated on

defense and rebounds, which kept them not far behind the Marines.

The Marines had a 34 - 26 lead at the end of the first half, with no sign of letting up.

Coming into the second half trailing by 8, the Bulldawgs used a new strategy.

"We needed to just regroup and use a different defense," Fields said.

The Bulldawgs offense gained momentum in the second half, tying the score at 36.

Tyler brought in 6 points, with two well-timed 3-point shots, sending the Bulldawgs into the final minutes of the second half at 40 - 41.

With the clock ticking away, both teams played tough.

The Marines fell behind at 48 - 52.

"We got two shots in and had to just hold it down," Tyler said.

The Bulldawgs held the lead as the Marines tried to rally with last minute attempts at three point shots, but the buzzer rang and the Bulldawgs won at 54 - 48.

"We were not really worried in the second half, we just needed to change up our defense," Johnson said.

With the trophy in hand, the Bulldawgs left Newman Gym with their second trophy after winning the Fort Stewart Championship.

"It feels good winning, and if we're in the championship next season, we're looking to repeat our performance," Johnson added.



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the game proved insurmountable for DFAC. When the buzzer sounded, there was no doubt who won the game and the installation championship.

"(USMC) played a great game," said Jeffrey Chatman, DFAC guard, who had a combined 29 points on the evening. "We were just too tired in game two."

Four players led USMC with double digits in scoring, while DFAC forward Lawrence Perry was the lone Soldier in double digits, 11 points, in game two.

Mike Hughes, Hunter intramural sports director, was pleased with how the tournament played out, but not sur-

prised by the outcome.

"When any team (DFAC) ends up in the loser's bracket, it's hard for them to come back," he said. "Ultimately, the Marines played well all season — their play was consistent, they were committed on the court, they were the conference champs, and they showed us tonight that they belonged here."

The evening concluded with a presentation of individual and team trophies for first and second place.

In the background, as USMC received their championship trophy, Chatman said with confidence, "We'll be back."
